Pacific sand Lance spawning in Mansons Landing and Smelt Bay. Mansons Landing is very important site on East Coast of Vancouver Island. Lakes Monitoring Work - winter monitoring work over the winter. Intertidal monitoring work around Cortes - over the winter diving and recording marine life. Mansons Landing Provincial Park - erosion control and Broom Bash. Nature is Good for you – Folk U partnership radio program. Normal Educational Program not run because of COVID. Summer Student-Autumn Barrett-Morgan - Goshawk survey, website updates, sensitive ecosystems. Foreshore monitoring Data found a home - 25 years of data – at Strait of Georgia Data Centre. Park's Contract SRD - picked up Whale Town Commons – manage 9 different parks and trails undertaken by Ryan and Alex.
